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## The easy way to cover UK news

- The NLA international media monitoring organisation (IMMO) licence copyright compliance for the supply of UK newspaper print and website content to end-user clients.
- IMMO is used by over 20 international MMOs and over 2,200 corporates
- The IMMO licence allows print digital and online and offline web content rights. It also includes paper delivery rights.
- All print and web sources licensed by the NLA are covered by the IMMO Licence.
- Users can self-source NLA content or receive it from an NLA licensed MMO.
- Users can receive 25 major titles directly from the NLA eClips.
- IMMO offers simple and cheap compliance for international monitoring companies dealing with low volumes of NLA content





#### Single, simple MMO licence

- Allows paper, web, scanned content and eClips delivery to clients
- Allows full UK content coverage
- Simplifies administration, PDLN standard reporting
- MMO manages client fees and administration

#### Simple pricing

- Per clip fees, paid by MMO
- NLA has held prices 5 years
- Low minimum fees for MMOs (e125pm)
- New minimum covers print, web and paper copying

#### Simple and Easy for end users

- Simple online end user licence, based on PDLN standards
- 2,200 organisations have signed
- No minimum fees for clients
- No end user agreement for paper copies

# Pricing is simple

- All fees paid are by MMOs (not end users)
- Fees are per client based on number of users at that client
- US\$ and other options are available



## IMMO covers all\* UK news content

- Digital all 1,400 plus NLA licensed UK print titles, delivered digitally by an NLA licensed MMO
- Web offline all 1,000 plus NLA licensed UK web titles, delivered digitally be an NLA licensed MMO
- Web link all 1,000 plus licensed UK web titles
- Direct feed option for top 25 NLA titles

# Easy for End Users



- Sign an End User Licence Agreement.
- Single end user licence covers all uses
- Digital users sign one online agreement
- No minimum fees for clients
- No end user agreement for paper copies
- There are NO fees associated with signing an International End User Licence Agreement as the MMO is responsible for paying for all copies
- If end-users wish to receive more than 500 hardcopy, digital and/or web links per month (very unlikely), they will need to have a UK NLA Business End User licence.



# Clients with wider coverage needs....?

MMOs with higher volume requirements can be covered by NLA UK offerings\*

### **UK Licences**

- eClips high price, low per copy fee, high end user minimum fee and licence
- Scanning high price low per copy fee, high end user minimum fee and licence
- Paper copying high minimum
- Web database licence different end user licence, lower fees



# Old eClips International deal - comparison

#### Zero cost and additional benefits in new agreement

- Wider rights, same price
- Allows full UK coverage delivery by NLA licensed MMOs to intl MMOs

#### New agreement is optional

NLA will maintain existing agreements for 12 months

#### If you transfer

- End users can maintain existing agreements
- New clients will sign new forms
- No change to eClips delivery
